Dear Grade 6 & 9 Parents;

We hope that this letter finds you and your family well. In May & June, students here at St. Francis of Assisi Middle School will write year-end final exams and provincial achievement tests in four subject areas: English Language Arts (ELA), Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies.

In English Language Arts (ELA), exams consist of two parts, typically written in May. However, for Grade 6 ELA, the PAT has been discontinued due to the new curriculum. Instead, students will participate in Field Tests, providing valuable feedback to the government while experiencing exam conditions without risk. Grade 6 teachers will administer these Field Tests this month to help students prepare for their final exam, fostering increased confidence. Two weeks later, Grade 6 students will undertake an in-class final writing assessment.

Similar Field Tests will be conducted for Grade 6 Math, with the Part A Field Test also scheduled for May. The grade 9 ELA Part A exam will continue as usual. Further details about assessments in June will be provided closer to the date.

We recognize that any test can cause anxiety for students. As a result, we work hard to ensure that the Provincial Achievement Tests are low-risk exams for students.
